Some highlights from this year include the below items.

- ACEC/MO updated our strategic plan, which provides our leadership a vision of priorities
 for the next 5 years. This spring, our Long Range Plan Committee convened with other
 volunteers for an intensive one-day retreat with follow-up phone calls to work on the
 future direction of ACEC/MO. This diversity of opinions and experiences that we bring

- For the 5th year in a row, we met our National PAC fundraising goal, coming in 17th in the nation for federal PAC fundraising. On the state level, we have increased our fundraising efforts, the membership has responded, and I thank you for that. In 2022, we held our first state PAC fundraiser which was incredibly successful in its first year. Your Board of Directors will continue to work on PAC fundraising, and I look forward to seeing what will be achieved in the future as a strong PAC gives our industry the ability work with legislators who need to learn more about the crucial issues that confront our industry and the state.
- We improved the effectiveness of our outreach to legislators in Washington, DC by using ACEC National's resources to coordinate in-person meetings with a number of key legislators. This was well attended and so successful that we are already planning future trips. At home, our members were very effective in nurturing our relationships with state legislators in their regions and with visits to the Capitol. In short, we had a successful year in advocacy which is another step towards our strategic goal of making ACEC/MO the state's premier voice and advocate of the consulting engineering industry in Missouri.

It has been an honor to serve as your Board Chair of such a prestigious organization. The experience has been amazing, and I think we have made great strides as ACEC/MO grows and enhances its services. 




Vision

ADVOCACY



It's job #1 at ACEC Missouri

In January 2021, ACEC/MO was tasked by legislative leadership to lead efforts on addressing Missouri's infrastructure funding crisis. After years of time and effort, the passage of Senate Bill 262 was a monumental success for our industry and for our partner organizations. This was a much-needed boost and along with the work that ACEC National did on the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act and the addition of American Rescue Plan Act monies, the entire consulting engineering industry is thriving.

In 2022, over 70 individual pieces of legislation were tracked and monitored at the state level. Topics covered were repeal of the gas tax, bidding on public works projects, business taxes, water infrastructure funding, just to name a few. ACEC/MO testified on multiple issues at committee hearings on infrastructure funding, state laws regarding design build and professional licensure. ACEC/MO was also successful in working against attempts to repeal the state's gas tax and working to ensure that ARPA monies could be spent on water and wastewater projects as efficiently as possible.



Presence

ACECMO staff maintain a full-time presence in the Capitol and work throughout the year with elected and state leaders and government officials in Jefferson City.



Engagement

ACEC/MO Members engage both state and federal officials throughout the year. This year ACEC/MO did their first ever independent "fly-in" at Washington D.C. and met in person with Representatives Cleaver, Graves, Luetkemeyer, Smith and U.S. Senator Roy Blunt.



Connection

Over the last year, arrangements were made to bring elected officials to Member offices and ACEC/MO events. This included Lt. Governor Mike Kehoe, House Transportation Chair Becky Ruth, Senate Minority Leader John Rizzo, Senators Lincoln Hough and Greg Razer and Senate President Pro Tem Dave Schatz to name a few.


