Message from the Board Chair

Over \$3B in transportation funding - need I say more?

This year, ACEC Missouri experienced several milestones, the biggest being the unprecedented increase in funding for Missouri's roads and bridges. These milestones add to the foundation of our organization and make us stronger with a more diverse set of opportunities for our members. This foundation also provides us with the ability to be more responsive to external challenges and the ever-changing dynamics that surround the world of engineering.

Some of our recent accomplishments include:

- Organizationally, ACEC Missouri has continued to pursue its strategic plan objective of reinforcing our organization as THE advocate of engineering companies and the engineering profession in Missouri. This year we served as the lead organization in the first ever joint advocacy day at the Missouri Capitol. Partnering with APWA, ASCE and MSPE, 60 engineers met in Jefferson City to deliver the message that "engineering matters" to the Missouri Legislature. Working together, we told our story of why engineers are important in the public policy process and outlined why our profession should have a seat at the table when issues of public health, welfare and safety are being discussed. We also continued the tradition of our Washington D.C. fly in. This year we expanded our visit and met with more members of the Missouri Congressional delegation than we ever have before, including the House Committee on Ways and Means Chair Jason Smith, who serves Missouri's 8th District.
- Key in our success to get over \$3B in transportation funding, our President & CEO, Morgan Mundell, held the position of Board Chair of Missourians for Transportation Investment for the 2023 legislative session. We worked tirelessly to fend off attempts to repeal SB262 and stop attempts to reduce infrastructure funding. We also served as one of the lead organizations of what is the largest infrastructure project in Missouri history, the rehabilitation and expansion of one of Missouri's most important economic assets, Interstate 70.
- Under the leadership of your Board of Directors, we expanded the opportunities for members to
 engage in political giving. In conjunction with our Fall meeting, the 1st Annual ACEC Missouri Sporting
 Clays Tournament was held to benefit the National PAC. This event led to Missouri meeting its
 fundraising goal for the sixth straight year with a record amount and Missouri meeting goal earlier
 than we ever have. This year we also continued our State PAC golf tournament at Porto Cima. For
 those of you who gave to either or both PAC's, I would sincerely like to say thank you. Political giving is
 a very important part of any government affairs program. Your generosity helps the voice of the
 engineering industry be heard.
- Identifying the need to diversify our programming and to serve our members as their primary resource on business practices, we took several steps. This spring, ACEC Missouri partnered with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources for the 1st Annual Environmental & Energy Seminar, which was a great success. I would like to thank Laura Mwirigi Rightler and Mark Bross, Environmental Committee Co-Chairs, for their leadership in bringing this event to fruition. We also continued the practice of webinars for our members on various topics such as legalization of recreational marijuana in Missouri, remote leadership, and employee retention interviews. And for the first time this year, we expanded our Future Leaders Academy from 3 sessions to 4 sessions to bring greater value to participants and allow for more time for networking and relationship building among our members.

I am honored to have served this past year as Chair of ACEC Missouri and I thank each of you for your time and support of our organization. We have made great strides over the last couple of years in areas that have been identified as important to our membership. Your Board of Directors continues to listen to your comments and suggestions, and works to provide you the best possible return on investment of your time and resources in being involved with the leading voice of engineering companies in Missouri.



EXPANDING OUR VOICE



ACEC Missouri continues to expand our voice among legislators

Following up on the adoption of the ACEC/MO Strategic Plan, our organization took the lead in promoting the engineering industry and the important work we do with a message delivered directly to the Missouri Legislature. Partnering with the American Public Works Association, the American Society of Civil Engineers and the Missouri Society of Professional Engineers, the industry worked together to create the "Engineering" Matters" brochure, and 60 engineers from various disciplines convened in February of 2023 for the first ever "Engineer's Day at the Capitol".

With the Capitol complex in Washington D.C. now being open, we expanded our DC fly-in and engaged in more in-person visits with the Missouri Congressional delegation. And this year we added House Transportation and Infrastructure staff to get more detailed information about infrastructure funding.

Future Leaders Academy - continuing to prepare the next generation of leaders in the consulting engineering industry

Expanding our focus on environmental and energy



2023 Policy Priorities



IIJA Implementation

Enactment of the bipartisan Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) provides a historic opportunity to upgrade our transportation, water, energy, and communications networks to improve the quality of life for all Americans. The programs and projects funded over the next five years will facilitate the efficient movement of people and goods, improve safety, provide clean water, enhance environmental clean-up and mitigation, address the impacts of climate change, and provide new economic development opportunities for our communities.



Project: Merchants Bridge Main Span Trusses & East Approach Location: St. Louis, MO; & Illinois

The Merchants Bridge had exceeded its design life. Reconstruction of the bridge was completed by providing engineering components of the main span trusses, deck approaches and the east approach.

ACEC Missouri requests that our members of Congress take the following positions:

- Ensure compliance with federal procurement rules so that contract terms and rates reflect actual costs and promote more utilization of value-based contracting.
- Protect project delivery reforms in the new law to reduce obstacles and facilitate efficient regulatory reviews.
- Adopt reasonable Buy America policies that accommodate access to necessary materials.
- Retain robust funding commitments in the law and reject reductions in user fees.

Project: I-44 Over Meramec River & I-270 Interchange Improvements Location: St. Louis, MO

The project required careful design and planning due to its heavy commuter traffic and function as a busy freight route.

INFRA/MEGA Grants for Missouri Interstates

I-70 and I-44 are critical state and regional corridors and a nationally important interstate. Improving Missouri's interstates ensure that they continue to serve as a safe, efficient, and cost-effective facility for those traveling and moving goods within the state.

The Missouri Legislature is currently debating a plan to use surplus monies to help expand and rehabilitate I-70. ACEC Missouri supports this plan and asks the Missouri Congressional delegation to extend assistance and support to this effort, when possible, through additional federal grants and funding.



FAA Reauthorization

One of our top priorities is designing 21st century aviation infrastructure that supports the safe and reliable movement of people and goods. To that end, ACEC Missouri supports the following:

- The reauthorization bill should include a substantial increase in authorized annual funding for the Airport Improvement Program (AIP) and an expansion of eligible uses. Funding for AIP has been relatively flat for nearly 20 years, despite significant unmet needs as identified in the FAA National Plan of Integrated Airport Systems report.
- We also strongly support an expansion of AIP eligibility for terminal improvement projects, as undertaken in the IIJA. With passenger travel returning to pre-pandemic levels, these projects are essential to relieving congestion, improving safety, and enhancing the passenger experience, all of which will promote economic growth in and around the airport facility.
- ACEC also continues to call on Congress to lift the outdated cap on Passenger Facility Charges (PFCs). These local user fees are an essential component of funding and financing a wide array of projects. Many airports have fully leveraged their available financing options under the current cap; modernizing the PFC will provide an additional tool to meet their infrastructure needs.

R&D Innovation & Amortization

Since 1954, Section 174 of the federal tax code allowed businesses to deduct qualified research expenses in the year those costs were incurred. Congress created the related R&D tax credit in 1981.

As part of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017, Congress changed how taxpayers write off R&D expenses. Starting on January 1, 2022, firms could no longer write off R&D expenses in the year they were incurred and now must amortize those expenses over five years in most cases.

ACEC Missouri urges Congress to approve a repeal or multi-year delay of the R&D amortization requirement as soon as possible.

WOTUS

The Biden Administration published a final rule on January 18, 2023, to revise the definition of "waters of the United States." 88 Fed. Reg. 3,004. This new rule will only create more confusion for consulting engineers and will inevitably slow down many of the important economic drivers that benefit our communities. This unnecessary regulatory red tape places a burden on landowners and small businesses, while stripping the states of their historic regulatory role. We need clean water and clear rules, which the final rule falls far short of delivering. ACEC Missouri supports concise regulatory language and certainty on the issue of WOTUS regulations.
