# **Governmental Affairs**



### It's job #1 at ACEC Missouri

Following up on the adoption of the ACEC/MO Strategic Plan, our organization took the lead in promoting the engineering industry and the important work we do with a message delivered directly to the Missouri Legislature. Partnering with the American Public Works Association, the American Society of Civil Engineers and the Missouri Society of Professional Engineers, the industry worked together to create the "Engineering Matters" brochure, and 60 engineers from various disciplines convened in February of 2023 for the first ever "Engineer's Day at the Capitol".

With the Capitol complex in Washington D.C. now being open, we expanded our DC fly-in and engaged in more in-person visits with the Missouri Congressional delegation. And this year we added House Transportation and Infrastructure staff to get more detailed information about infrastructure funding.



#### Presence

ACECMO staff maintain a full-time presence in the Capitol and work throughout the year with elected and state leaders and government officials in Jefferson City.



### **Engagement**

ACEC/MO continued our independent "fly-in" at Washington D.C. this year. Members met in person with Representatives Eric Burlison, Mark Alford, Blaine Luetkemeyer and House Ways and Means Chair, Jason Smith.



#### Connection

Through local events and Council Meetings, ACEC/MO sponsored meetings with House Speaker Dean Plocher, Senate President Pro Tem Caleb Rowden, 6 additional members of the Missouri House, and 2 Missouri Senators.



## **Engaging Our Clients**

ACEC/MO member volunteers are the backbone of the organization and committee work is one of the most important benefits to our members. ACEC/MO offers its members a wide variety of committees and liaison committees tailored to the special interests of its members. This participation will dramatically increase the return on your dues investment in ACEC/MO. # **Awards**



### Engineering Excellence Awards & QBS Awards

ACEC/MO offers your firm the opportunity to showcase its creativity with the annual Engineering Excellence Awards competition. This program promotes public awareness of engineering and how important it is to everyone's life. The top state winners are eligible to enter their projects in the national competition.

ACEC/MO also has an annual QBS Award where we recognize governmental and non-governmental agencies for their use of the QBS process.





# Meetings & Seminars

ACEC/MO holds quarterly meetings which are held in Columbia, Jefferson City, Kansas City, Osage Beach and St. Louis alternately during the year to provide easy access for the majority of member firms. The meetings provide forums for sharing ideas and experiences between experienced managers in engineering and often lead to partnering on projects in the state.

The Council also provides business-related seminars for member firms throughout the year. ACEC/MO can, provide attendees at these seminars with professional development hours (PDH's). ACEC/MO seminars during the normal year collectively provide for a total of eighteen plus (18 +) PDH's. ACEC/MO hosts an annual seminar with PSMJ to provide more PDH's for members. ACEC/MO also holds an annual Future Leaders Academy with 36.5 PDH's.

Meetings are also held twice a year by ACEC in different locations across the United States. The Fall Conference is normally held in September/October and the Annual Conference (Spring) is normally held in April/May. These conferences provide for expanded forums on business related issues for member firms through a series of seminars tailored to meet the conference objectives.

# Insurance

Many member firms in ACEC/MO participate in insurance programs that are available through ACEC. These programs are cost effective and include: life, health, dental and vision plans, business and professional liability insurance plans, and retirement plans. All new member firms are urged in inquire into these plans and take advantage of any savings that might accrue to them as a member of ACEC/MO. Often, the money that ACEC/MO member firms save by participating in these programs more than pays for the cost of their membership investment.







# **Publications**

ACEC/MO and ACEC maintain contact with members through various publications sent routinely to member firms. ACEC/MO publishes a "Newsletter" that goes out each month to members, an Annual Report, and a directory of all member firms. ACEC/MO also sends out a weekly legislative report to all member representatives during the session.

ACEC/MO's website (www.acecmo.org) provides members with an even more effective service. We provide timely information on upcoming meetings and seminars, legislative updates, and other industry news. The website also contains an ACEC/MO member roster where potential clients are able to search by firm, areas of practice and location.

ACEC publishes "The Last Word", weekly blog, the "Engineering, Inc.," a national magazine that is published every two-months, and a national directory of all member organizations, which is online.

ACEC also operates and maintains a complete "Bookshop" in Washington devoted to publications related to the Business practices of member firms.
