First off, thank you to everyone who participated in the 1st Annual Engineer's Day at the Missouri Capitol. We had roughly 60 people show up to represent the engineering profession and let the Missouri Legislature know we are here and why they should listen to us. I think for an inaugural event, the turnout was phenomenal. We met with Representative Don Mayhew in the House Lounge (pictured below) and also House Majority Floor Leader Jon Patterson. Throughout the day, I saw members of ACEC/MO, APWA, ASCE and MSPE going out of individual offices and leaving our "Engineering Matters" brochure. I also had comments from a number of legislators and staff about the presence that engineers had in the building that day.

We are already working on next year's event and hope to have a "save the date" email out in the coming weeks.

INDUSTRY NEWS

New Guidance on Implementation of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

On Friday, FHWA Administrator Shailen Bhatt circulated new guidance on implementation of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act and the Administration's priorities. The memo supersedes guidance issued in December 2021 that was the subject of some confusion and concern. particularly with respect to the way it discouraged construction of new highway capacity projects. ACEC had joined several industry stakeholder groups in encouraging Administrator Bhatt to rescind the previous memo (view letter). Congressional Republicans had repeatedly raised questions about the earlier guidance in oversight hearings with Secretary Buttigleg and threatened legislative action to challenge the memo because it was viewed as a regulatory measure directing State DOT decisions on use of formula funds that were not consistent with the flexibilities afforded in the law.



We have some very impressive numbers associated with our Winter Meeting this week. The soccer stadium tours are maxed out on capacity. We have over 150 people for the EEA Banquet and 80 registered for the meeting. We have speakers for both the Transportation and Environmental Committees and special guest Dave Bender will be joining us from ACEC National to give his perspective on what the new Congress looks like.

Last week, Missouri Governor Mike Parson and Attorney General Andrew Bailey announced that Missouri has joined with 23 other states in filing a lawsuit regarding the EPA's recent "Waters of the United States" (WOTUS) rule. Proponents of the lawsuit state that the new rule goes beyond the power Congress delegated in the Clean Water Act and raises serious constitutional concerns. EPA Administrator Michael Regan recently told Brownfield the release of the administration's WOTUS rule happened before the ruling on Sackett vs. EPA because there are aspects of the rule the agency wanted to get on record. Bailey argued that the Supreme Court should issue a ruling on the Sackett case before the EPA issues any more rules. The EPA issued a new rule on December 30th, 2022.

Last Wednesday, the House Transportation Infrastructure and Transportation Accountability Committees held a joint meeting for an informal presentation by MoDOT on their revenues and project lists. The meeting became contentious at times over the recent passage of SB262 and the request for general revenues for I-70. While the Governor's budget of \$859 million for I-70 was reduced by only \$48 million in the Appropriations hearing, there is a great deal of speculation of what will happen in the Budget Committee.

Finally, registration is open for the ACEC/MO Environmental & Energy Seminar. We have partnered with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources to put together a program specifically addressing the policy area of alternative energy, electrification of transportation infrastructure and PFAS. We will wrap the day up with an ACEC/MO Environmental Committee meeting. This is a great opportunity to network with DNR staff and meet with experts in these fields. Please click here to register ASAP as we may have to limit attendance. I hope to see you this week in St. Louis!
