Telematics for Engineering Firms

Is telematics an effective method to control risk, lower insurance premiums, and prevent nuclear auto liability verdicts? The ACEC Business Insurance Trust addresses these questions in their latest guide, <u>Telematics for Engineering Firms</u>.

For many engineering firms, auto liability represents the largest single risk exposure, and yet, in a hardening insurance marketplace, it is becoming increasingly difficult for firms to control current and future costs of insurance. According to the Council of Insurance Agents & Brokers Commercial Property & Casualty Market Report Q4 2021, excess/umbrella results show an average of a 15% rate increase while auto liability rate increases were closer to 10%.

They recommend that firms with a small or large fleet of vehicles consider telematics. If done correctly, they believe the benefits outweigh the technology costs and the challenges of implementing the program. A strong return on investment (ROI) should be realized short term after the implementation of telematics due to improved fuel economy, reduced vehicle maintenance costs, increased productivity, and enhanced safety.

Council of Environmental Quality Changes to NEPA Implementing Regulations

Last week, CEQ published a final rule repealing certain changes to NEPA regulations that had been put in place by the previous Administration. The new rule undoes several reforms that we had generally supported, along with the U.S. Chamber and many other business and infrastructure organizations. This has implications for the environmental reviews that our members perform for their clients and for the project delivery and regulatory approval process.

The CEQ press release is <u>here</u>. The final rule is posted in the Federal Register <u>here</u>. This is Phase 1 of a two-stage process, with more comprehensive changes expected in Phase 2. The CEQ action repeals three changes that had been made in 2020, and essentially reverts these requirements to the preexisting status:

- Expanded Consideration of Alternatives the rule removes the focus on the stated goals of the
 project applicant in the Purpose and Need Statement and expands the parameters for the range of
 reasonable alternatives that an agency can consider and analyze in any environmental impact
 statement.
- **Agency NEPA Procedures** the rule allows individual agencies to impose more requirements in their agency-specific NEPA implementing procedures than the requirements set forth in the CEQ rules.
- **Definition of Effects** the final rule reinstates the requirement to analyze the direct, indirect, and cumulative impacts of a project, removing the 2020 rule's criterion of a close causal relationship as a prerequisite to requiring NEPA analysis.

When CEQ first proposed the changes last fall, ACEC filed comments that were developed by a working group of members from the Transportation Committee and the Water, Energy, & Environment Committee with expertise in environmental regulations. Our comments on the rule are here. We had expressed concern that undoing the 2020 changes may unnecessarily delay or block performance of major environmental, health and safety goals and undermine some of the benefits of the investments in the IIJA. Simply put, the changes are likely to waste time and money on unnecessary analysis, subject proposed projects to more litigation, and create additional uncertainties in the regulatory review process. This means that IIJA and other funds may not be as impactful because of project delays, and private client projects particularly in the energy market will be subjected to more burdensome standards.

We are committed to staying engaged with the Administration and agency regulators to ensure effective project delivery processes that timely meet priority national environmental and social challenges, including climate change. As information on CEQ's Phase 2 plans becomes available, we will circulate that to the members and our committees will be engaged to help us review and provide industry feedback. MDNR Reschedules ARPA Webinars

The Missouri Department of Natural Resources has rescheduled two free webinars to provide community leaders information about state ARPA funding programs for public water projects. The webinars will now be offered from **2:00-3:00 PM** on **May 11, 2022**, and **10:00-11:00 AM** on **May 12, 2022**. Each one-hour webinar is designed to help communities better understand the different grant opportunities and to more easily navigate the application process. (Both webinars will provide the same information.)

The Missouri General Assembly is considering an allocation of ARPA funds to the Department of Natural Resources for competitive community water infrastructure grants for communities to complete drinking water, wastewater and stormwater infrastructure projects, or to conduct lead service line inventories. Both webinars will include an overview of the following topics:

- Grant program funding amounts
- Application process
- Project scoring criteria
- Application deadline and timeline for awards
- Grant caps
- Eligible applicants
- Eligible and ineligible project types
